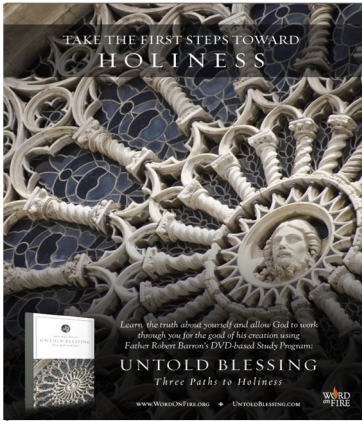

3. Realizing Your Life is Not About You

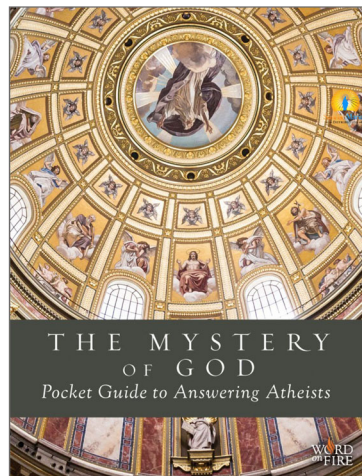

## FORMATION FOR CONFIRMATION DURING 2019-2020

**SPECIAL NOTE: Confirmation preparation will begin a transition this year. In 2019, Confirmation will be open to BOTH 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Grades, providing they are discerning and walking toward the “*signs of readiness*” for the sacrament of Confirmation (see listing below).**

**Beginning in 2020, Confirmation preparation will be available to 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades. In 2021, Confirmation preparation will be available to 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades.**

**We will continue moving down the Confirmation age each year until we reach the Pueblo Diocese recommended age grouping which will be between ages 10-12.**

**All high school teens are welcome to enter Sacramental Formation for Confirmation so long as they:**

- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Reconciliation
- Have participated in 1 full year of Discipleship/Religious Education prior
- Are currently participating in a 2<sup>nd</sup> year of Discipleship/Religious Education
- Actively willing to commit to growth in the “*signs of readiness*” (indicated below)
- Participate in a variety of retreats, service experiences, and Parish life
- Have parents along with Sponsors, who are to be intimately involved in Confirmation formation

**Confirmation is about discipleship and mission — drawing persons into the life, work and mission of the Church.**

**The focus is discipleship**—What is the candidate’s relationship with God like? How has he/she grown in that relationship? Is he/she committed to a life in Christ?

**The standard is readiness**—Is the candidate ready to receive the sacrament with the proper disposition? If not, how can I help him/her to become ready? In what way does the candidate still need to grow in his/her relationship with God before he/she is ready?

**The process is one of growth and discernment**—Preparing for the sacrament is not merely about completing a specific program. Any sacramental preparation program’s job is to be one aid among many for the growth of individual candidates in their relationship with God.

**What are the “signs of readiness” to receive Confirmation?**

In addition to having interviews with the Parish leadership (including the Pastor) to determine when a young person is ready for Confirmation, it will be an **ongoing process** with specific “*signs of readiness*” that the young person and the family will use for discernment for the reception of the Sacrament.

**Signs of readiness include:**

- Demonstrating an understanding of the Sacrament
- Desire and intent to receive the Sacrament
- Committing to continue to live the Catholic faith beyond the Confirmation
- Understanding spiritual gifts, vocational discernment and charitable outreach
- Name of Saint chosen (and explanation of why)
- Name(s) of qualified Sponsor(s)
- Names of other people who will support the candidate on their journey
- Written “*Plan of faith for life*” (for ongoing Sunday Mass, daily prayer, and regular confession)
- Write a “*Letter of Petition*” in candidates own wording, explaining desire for the Sacrament of Confirmation; including Candidates “*Conversation with the Pastor.*”





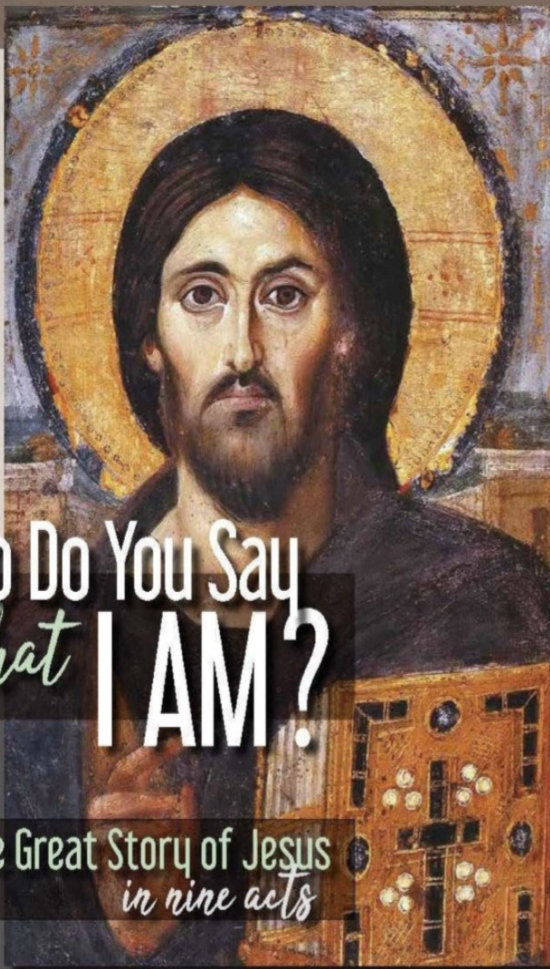
## Retreat Opportunity:

## RCIA

**Sunday, September 22nd at 12:00 p.m. in Adrians Hall**

Many adults entering the Catholic Church, or those just thinking about it, follow a process known as the **RCIA** – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. On Sunday, September 22nd, we will host the initial time to come and greet leaders from the Parish, ask questions about the steps to becoming Catholic, what do the sessions look like, etc. All are welcome!

**Sunday, September 29th RCIA (Becoming Catholic) at 12:00 p.m.**

The RCIA process has several distinct stages. These Catholic RCIA stages are a **good model** of faith development itself:

- **Inquiry:** the initial period before you decide to enter the Catholic Church. You're asking questions and checking it out, but are not sure if you are ready to commit. Questions in this phase focus upon God, His role throughout history, scripture, the person and mission of Jesus, etc.
- **Catechumenate:** those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called *catechumens*, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, you're developing your faith and are being "catechized" – learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life.
- **Purification and preparation:** The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you prepare to commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. If you're following the RCIA process, you'll go through a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period.
- **Initiation** itself, the culmination of the whole process! You're received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you'll receive the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. (If you've already been baptized, you won't be baptized again.)
- **Mystagogy:** after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.

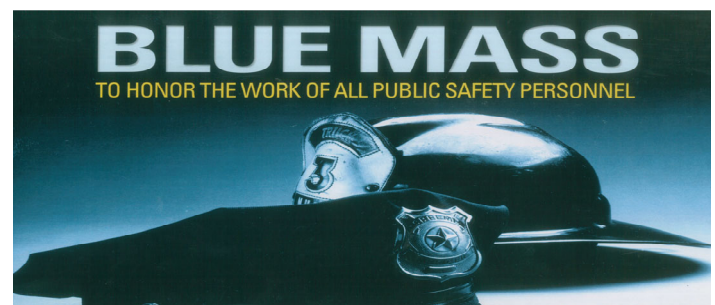

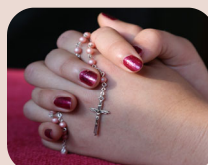

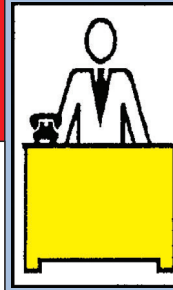
