
In the last several weeks you have read wonderful "one-liners" from ministers sharing how ministry is enhancing their personal relationship with Jesus.

"Untold Blessing"


Catholic Fellowship gathers on Tuesdays from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. in Sister Joan's Room (Little



THE SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION IN THE DIOCESE OF PUEBLO

Children are required to have sufficient knowledge and careful preparation to understand the mystery of Christ in the Eucharist according to their capacity, and can receive the Body and Blood of the Lord with faith and devotion.

It is the responsibility of parents, and those who take the place of parents, along with the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession.

The following indications are necessary to show that my child is ready to receive the Sacrament of First Communion:

- Commitment by parents/guardians to bring candidate to weekly Mass attendance on Sundays & Holy Days
- Daily Prayer
- Completed Formation
- First Reconciliation is to take place before Eucharist;
 - a.) The candidate is instructed concerning and understands sin (contrition, confession, satisfaction, and absolution)
 - b.) The candidate is instructed in a practical manner on how to go to confession.
 - c.) It is reinforced that the candidate should begin receiving the sacrament *regularly* after receiving First Reconciliation.

Discerning with Pastor

This discernment will focus on the parents' and candidate's relationship with Jesus, understanding of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, and the right frame of mind to receive the sacrament. This could be accomplished in part by the candidate telling the story of his/her relationship with Jesus up to this point in his/her life.

RCIA

Many adults entering the Catholic Church, or those just thinking about it, follow a process known as the **RCIA** – the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. All are welcome!

Sunday, September 29th—RCIA (Becoming Catholic) at 12:00 p.m.

The RCIA process has several distinct stages. These Catholic RCIA stages are **a good model** of faith development itself:

- Inquiry: the initial period before you decide to enter the Catholic Church. You're asking questions and checking it out, but are not sure if you are ready to commit. Questions in this phase focus upon God, His role throughout history, scripture, the person and mission of Jesus, etc.
- Catechumenate: those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called *catechumens*, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, you're developing your faith and are being "catechized" learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life
- Purification and preparation: The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you prepare to commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. If you're following the RCIA process, you'll go through a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period.
- Initiation itself, the culmination of the whole process! You're received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you'll receive the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. (If you've already been baptized, you won't be baptized again.)
- Mystagogy: after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.


