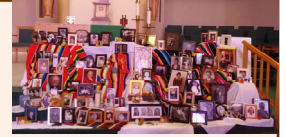

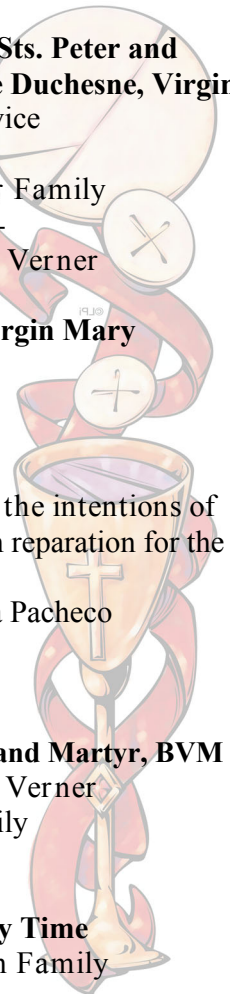

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The First Quarter report is usually the lowest of the four quarters because two months are in Summer (when people are away on vacation). You can see from this report that we continue to manage our expenses well, keeping them under what we budgeted. Our Collection income is short \$13,665 of our budget projection, but since more people are now participating in the Diocesan Ministry Fund (DMF) I am not concerned. With the refund we anticipate in May, I'd say we're doing a little better than breaking even. Our balance is \$11,927 greater than budgeted, for the same reason. As you can see, we had projected to be "in the red" for the First Quarter. We're usually back "in the black" around April and expect no different this coming year.

My biggest concern, as Pastor, is purchasing a new Chiller in January to keep the parish hall, sanctuary and front rows of the church cool in summer. It's about a 3-month process from placing the order until final installation, so I would like to order it in January because it can get warm sometimes by late April. But we need \$54,000 to do this. Please remember CTK if you need to make a charitable deduction this year! I truly need some angels, or it'll be a warm summer ahead. – Fr, John O.



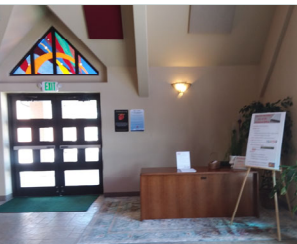

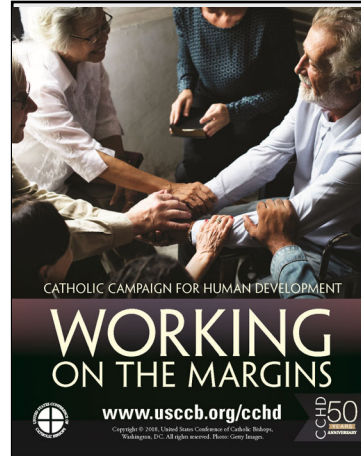


Memorial Mass for Children who died before birth by miscarriage, stillbirth or abortion.

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads.

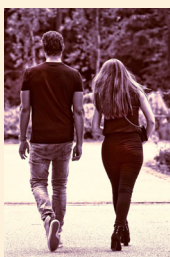

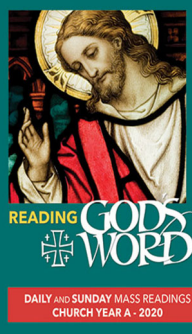
Silent Peace Walk at the River Walk on Sunday, December 8th at 2:00 p.m.

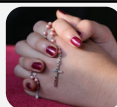
