We have a shortfall in income of approximately \$27K, but I think this is largely due to the increased participation in DMF so it's a wash. All expense categories were under budget except



grounds keeping and maintenance (\$5,526 over).

Next month's report (end of December) will give us clarity (every parish counts on generosity at Christmas time). The big "lemon" ahead is our need to replace our Chiller cooling system – it's an extra \$54,000 expense we hadn't anticipated. I am praying (seriously) that our parish family members will come through for us on this. I hope more of our family members will adopt the attitude of stewards: that we give because we need to give.



TRUST IN GOD

On this final Sunday of Advent our scriptures focus on the historical birth of Jesus, who is son of David and Son of God, child and king, Jesus and Emmanuel.

Isaiah the prophet begs Ahaz to ask for a sign, to allow God to offer him reassurance of the survival of the Davidic dynasty. The king hypocritically refuses to "tempt the LORD" in that way (Isaiah 7:12), but the prophet foretells the birth of a son, an heir to the throne, who will prove the Lord's enduring protection of God's chosen lineage on the throne of David. The child will be called Emmanuel.

Matthew's reference to this history in his description of the birth of Jesus highlights the contrast between the faithless refusal of trust shown by Ahaz, and the complete trust in God shown by Mary and Joseph in bringing about the birth of Jesus Christ. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
