



Our total income is better than it appears. Currently we are due a \$27,714 refund from the Diocesan Ministry Fund in May or June. That places us at \$5,993 short of the projected income we budgeted. We have maintained expenses well in-line; we're only \$580 in excess of our projection. With the DMF refund included, our net is actually \$7,900 in the red – not the \$36,614 indicated.

Bring your candles with you to Mass to have them blessed for personal or family use.


This feast celebrates the purification of Mary and the first entry of Jesus, the Light of the world, into the Temple. Under Mosaic law, women had to present themselves and any male child in the Temple 40 days after giving birth for a purification rite (some prayers said for the mother by a priest). This is when the Holy Man Simeon and the prophetess Anna proclaimed that Jesus was the Messiah. Simeon called him the "Light of revelation for the Gentiles" and so this feast became associated with the Blessing of Candles.

And so we'll all light a candle next weekend, like we do at the Easter Vigil, to celebrate the Light of Christ, the Light of the world. The French traditionally celebrate this day with pancakes or crepes. Enjoy some yourself at home or at a restaurant after Mass!






Catholic Connection Sundays resume this Sunday, January 26th at 9:30 am in the Little Flower Formation Center.


