In our first session, **EXODUS, A people set apart**, we will reflect on the Call of Abraham; age of the Patriarchs; bondage in Egypt; Exodus; wilderness wanderings; arrival in the Promised Land; and time of the Judges.



The Jewish people became a nation through the events of the Exodus. And for hundreds of years, during the period of the Judges, their only king was the Lord.

In many ways, that first divine king of the Israelites cannot help but remind us of Jesus. Like Jesus, the Lord miraculously fed his people, giving them manna, bread, in the wilderness. The Lord brought them to a mountain to teach them. He shepherded, taught, and healed them. He dwelt among them in a tabernacle.

The Lord rebuked and cast out demons, the so-called “gods” of Egypt. He referred to himself as “I AM.” He demanded holiness and set his people apart from the practices of their pagan neighbors.

Still, there was this crucial difference: When confronted with a hostile power, Pharaoh, the Lord had triumphed over him with overwhelming power. Jesus, in contrast, had stood before Pilate as a severely beaten prisoner. At the pivotal moment, Jesus presents himself as powerless, meek as a lamb.
